2011 Fruit & Nut Trees

While many fruit trees are self-fertile, they are better when pollinized by another variety.

APPLE

Braeburn, semi-dwarf

Medium sized; orange-red blush over yellow ground. Crisp, sweet-tart flesh. Stores well. Late to Ripen.

Gala, semi-dwarf

A crisp, rich flavored apple; reddish orange skin with yellow stripes. Good for cooking and eating fresh. Ripens early, is adapted to both cold and warm winter areas. Requires a Pollinizer. (500 hours chilling).

Golden Delicious, semi-dwarf

A longtime favorite, this apple is a sweet well flavored variety. It is good food eating fresh and for cooking.

Granny Smith, semi-dwarf

Large, bright to yellowish green, firm fleshed, tart. Good quality. Stores well; great for cooking. Ripens midseason.

Gravenstein, semi-dwarf

Large, vigorous tree. Crisp, juicy, fine-grained, yellowish white flesh, fine flavor, large, round to slightly flattened. Orangish yellow fruit with red striped, thin skin. The very best for cooking and cider. Self fertile, but pollinizes best with Red or Yellow Delicious, Fuji, or Gala.

Honeycrisp, semi-dwarf

Ripens mid-season. Medium size, red, firm, crisp; excellent sweet-tart flavor. Very hardy. Resistant To fire blight, somewhat resistant to scab.

Johnathan, semi-dwarf

Small to medium, roundish oblong apple with bright red skin. Juicy, moderately tart, crackling, crisp, brightly. All-purpose apple, good keeper.

Jonagold, semi-dwarf

Late mid-season. Large; heavy red striping over yellow ground. Firm, juicy; fine mildly tart Flavor. Taste-test favorite. Productive tree. Won't pollinate other varieties.

McIntosh, semi-dwarf

Medium to large, bright red, nearly round fruit. Snowy white, tender flesh. Excellent tart flavor. Very Good fresh, or in sauces, pies, or cider. Needs pollinator.

APPLE, CONT.

Red Delicious, semi-dwarf

High yielding, fast growing tree. Needs full sun all day for best fruit production. Fine-grained, tender mild flavor, crisp, juicy flesh. Holds crispness and flavor until May. Large, waxy, dark red fruit. Excellent dessert apple. Great for fresh eating. Pollinize with Yellow Delicious.
Needs a pollinizer, and does not pollinize other apples.

Red Fuji, semi-dwarf

A redder skinned bud sport of Fuji. The apples are sweet, crisp and keep well. They ripen mid Season. Is self fertile and a good pollinizer for other apples.

Red McIntosh. Semi-dwarf

Red and green skin, tart flavor, tender white flesh. Ripens late September. Superior eating apple and good for applesauce, cider and pies.

4-in-1, semi-dwarf

Red McIntosh, Liberty, Lodi, Fuji

Tydemans' Late Orange Apple, semi-dwarf

Old heirloom variety. Hardy. Good storing apple.

APRICOT

Chinese, semi-dwarf

A cold hardy, frost hardy, fruiting apricot. Sets heavy crops of small to medium sized sweet fruit. Is recommended for difficulty, spring frost-prone climates. Is self-fertile.

Harglow, semi-dwarf

Medium-size orange fruit. Sometimes blush red. Firm, sweet, flavorful. Late blooming, early maturity. Disease resistant.

CHERRY

4 in 1, Semi-dwarf

A fruiting cherry with Van, Bing, Sam and Rainier all grafted onto one stem.

Bing, Semi-dwarf or dwarf– Midseason

Bing is the leading commercial sweet cherry of the western states. The fruit is dark mahogany in color, firm and juicy. Exceptionally large fruit of the finest quality is typical of this variety. Large spreading tree. Pollinize with Montmorency, Rainier, or Stella. Hardy to minus 20 F.

Black Tatarian, semi-dwarf– Early

Dark skinned, sweet cherrt. Much like the Bing, but a slightly smaller fruit. Ripens early. Good Pollinizer for Bing cherries. Pollinize with any other variety. Hardy to –20F

Montmorency, semi-dwarf– Midseason

The principal commercial tart cherry grown for processing. Montmorency is bright red on the outside and has a clear yellow flesh. The tree is early bearing, productive and self fruitful. Hardy to –40 F.

Rainier, dwarf or semi-dwarf– Midseason

Large, yellow fruit with a red blush. Firm, clear to light yellow flesh. Fine texture and distinct flavor. Colorless juice. Low acidity, so not a good cooking cherry. Vigorous, upright, spreading tree. Early bearing, very productive. Exceptional holding ability after harvest. Resists cracking, spurs, and dou bles. Pollinize With Bing, Montmorency, or Stella. Hardy to minus 20 F.

Royal Ann. Semi-dwarf

Tart, pie cherry. Yellow blushed with red. Pollinize with any variety. Hardy to –20F.

CHERRY, CONT

Stella, semi-dwarf– Midseason

Large heart-shaped, dark red fruit. Sweet, juicy flesh. Rich flavor. Ideal for home orchard. Very vigorous, productive tree. Moderate crack resistance. Fine pollenizer for other varieties. Ripens in mid-June. First self-fertile sweet cherry. Hardy to minus 20 F.

Utah Giant, semi-dwarf

A large, firm and flavorful, dark red, sweet cherry. Need pollinator. Bing and Rainier are recommended.

Van, semi-dwarf

A very cold hardy, heavy bearing, sweet cherry. The fruit is similar to Bing, though usually a little smaller. Requires a pollinizer; most other sweet cherries will work.

NECTARINE

Fantasia, semi-dwarf

Large, freestone. Bright yellow and red skin; firm yellow flesh. Sweet, rich flavor. Midseason. Vigorous tree.

Flavortop, semi-dwarf

Medium to large, egg-shaped fruit. Skin is mostly red over a bright yellow background. Firm, smooth textured, yellow, freestone flesh of excellent quality. Vigorous, productive, self-fertile tree. Large, showy blossoms. Hardy to minus 20 degrees F.

PEACH

Elberta, semi-dwarf

Large, oblong, yellow fruit with a light red blush. Fine grained, yellow, freestone flesh. Sweet, rich flavor. Good for canning, eating and freezing. Ripens in late July. Vigorous, self-fruitful tree. Hardy to minus 20 degrees F.

Frost, semi-dwarf

Medium size, freestone fruit. Yellow skin with slight red blush; yellow flesh. Tangy flavor. Midseason to late. Resistant to peach leaf curl.

Red Haven, semi dwarf

The standard for early peaches. Medium, nearly fuzz-less fruit; bright all-over red. Firm, yellow flesh becomes freestone as it ripens. Great for dessert, canning and freezing. Tolerates handling well; flesh resists browning. Vigorous, strong growing, self-fertile tree bears young. Hardy to minus 20 degrees F. Self fertile.

Veteran, semi-dwarf

Round, good quality, medium to large, golden yellow fruit with slight red blush. Freestone when fully ripe. Yellow, firm flesh with coarse grain, easy to peel. Good for eating, canned or frozen. Reliable producer in cold, wet weather. One of the cold hardiest varieties. Self-fruitful tree is vigorous grower and bears early with consistent yields. Hardy to minus 20 degrees.

PEAR

Bartlett, semi-dwarf

A sweet, juicy pear with yellow skin. Is good for canning and eating fresh. Needs a pollenizer.

Comice, semi-dwarf

A larger rounded fruit with greenish-yellow skin. Excellent flavor and texture. Ripens after cold storage (40 degrees for 1 month). Late maturity, good tree form. Somewhat susceptible to fire blight. Is self-fertile in most climates.

Red Bartlett, semi-dwarf

A red-skinned version of 'Bartlett Pear'. Has sweet, juicy, firm, white flesh. Is good for fresh eating or canning. Is self-fertile in most climates.

PEAR, CONT.

20th Century Dwarf, semi-dwarf

Medium size, round lopsided, long stemmed, yellow fruit with greenish mottling. Thin, tender skin. Juicy, crisp flesh, mild flavor. Stores through January. Medium size tree. Partly self-fertile; pollinize with Bartlett, or Shinseiki. Tolerates drought and heat. Hardy to minus 10 degrees F.

4-in-One, semi-dwarf

Varieties to be determined.

PLUM

French Petite, semi-dwarf

Self fruitful. Small. Red to purplish black skin; greenish yellow flesh. Very sweet and mild. Late. Standard drying prune of California. Good for canning.

Italian, semi-dwarf

Mid-size, red to black-purple skin prune with yellow flesh. Sweet flavor, good fresh, canned, or dried. Mid-season maturity; self-fertile.

Santa Rosa, semi-dwarf

Very large, round to oval, purplish-red fruit covered with light dots. Fragrant, fine textured, cling-stone flesh, purplish near the skin, yellow streaked pink near the pit. Keeps and ships well. Ripens midseason. Hardy to minus 20 degrees. Japanese Plum. Partially self-fertile, but production improved when planted with other Japanese varieties.

Satsuma, semi-dwarf

Medium to large dark red fruit with small pit. Firm meaty and juicy flesh with a sweet lively flavor. Excellent for fresh eating, cooking or preserves. Ripens mid to late season. Partially self-fertile but improved when pollinized with Shiro or Santa Rosa.

2011 Nut Trees

ALMOND

All-in-One

Marianna rootstock, hardy to -30F. Number 1 almond for home orchards. Heavy crops of soft shell nuts with sweet, flavorful kernels. Hot summer required to ripen. 15ft. Tree, very winter and frost hardy.

Hall's Hardy

Hard shelled, small nut. Pink blooms come late, an advantage in late-frost regions. Tree may actually be a peach-almond hybrid. Partially self-fertile.

WALNUT

Black Walnut

Zone 4. 75' x 75'. A slow growing large, rounded tree that bears thick hulled edible nuts in the fall. It is prized for its wood and great stature in old age.
